LAST MEETING

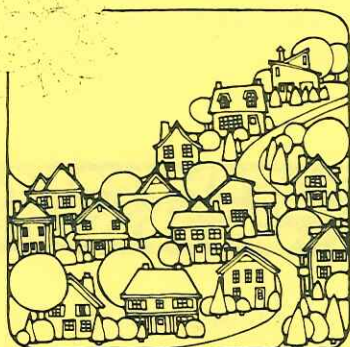
On the recommendation of the Nominating Committee, the following slate of officers was elected by the membership at the March meeting.

Officers for 1978 will be elected in November, 1977, and installed in December.

After the close of the business meeting, Mayor Ann Crichton spoke on Decatur development, stressing that the aim of the City Commission is to preserve Decatur as a residential city, providing the best of services, while maintaining the lowest possible tax base.

Decatur is actively involved in preparing studies on land use, transportation, and economic development. In order to be certain that the resulting plans meet residents' needs, goals, and objectives, the planning procedure is being brought to the neighborhood level through a series of public meetings.



Ms. Helen Myers, Decatur City Planner, has announced two sets of neighborhood meetings. At the first, city officials and staff will listen to residents' ideas and desires for their own neighborhood. City staff will then formulate plans, and during the second meetings these plans will be presented to residents for further discussion and revision.

The first neighborhood meeting is scheduled in conjunction with our regular WPNA meeting on April 24. This is your opportunity to tell city officials what you do and do not want for your neighborhood. A nursery will be provided.

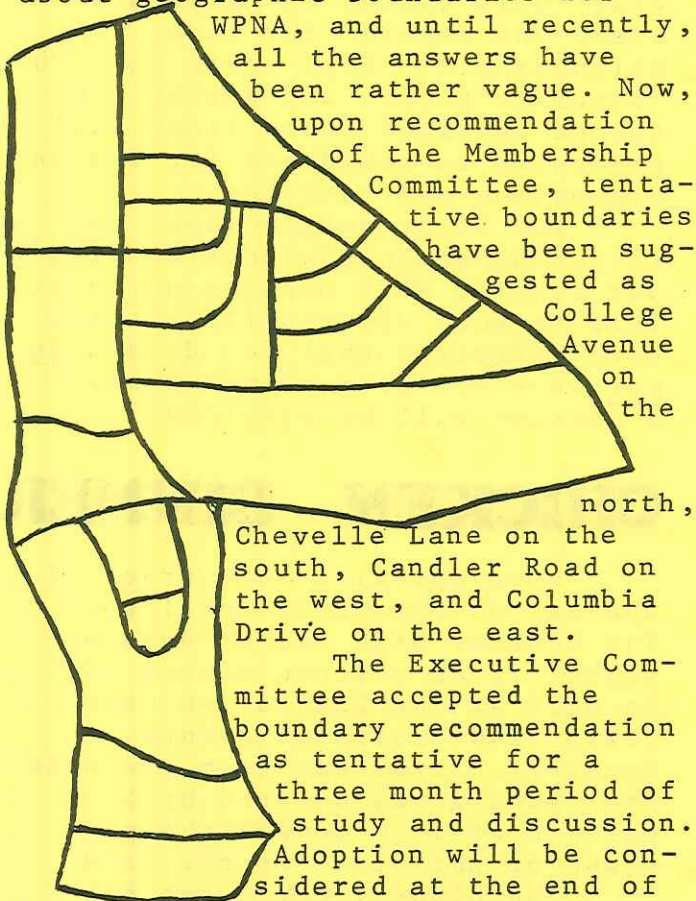

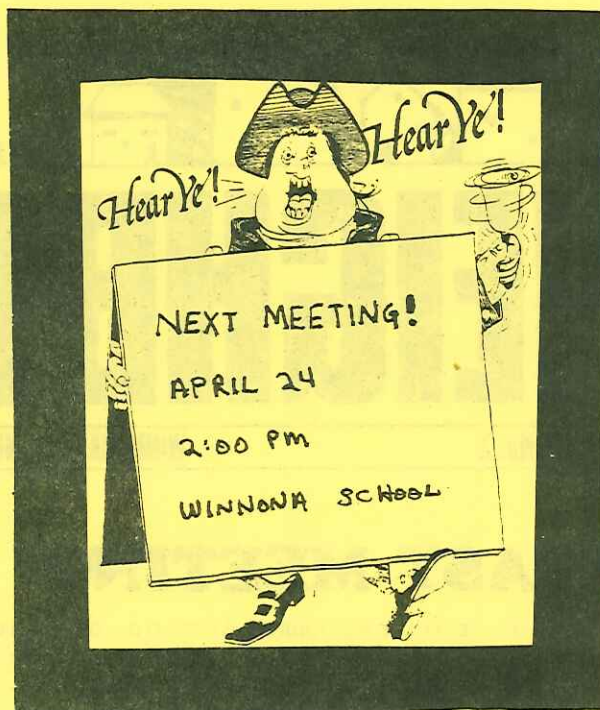
Boundaries
