



HEALTH CENTER OPENS JAN. 26th

The Oakhurst Community Health
Center will begin to provide primary
health care services out of temporary
space located on the second floor of
the east wing of the old Scottish
Rite Crippled Children's Hospital on
the 26th of January. The initial
hours of operation will be limited
to Monday and Wednesday evenings
and one-half day on Saturday.
Regular daytime hours will be added
once renovation work on the health
center's permanent facility (located
immediately below) is completed.

The overall goal of the OCHC is to improve the health status of individuals by making available a full range of basic health services designed to meet the needs of the entire family with an overriding emphasis on preventive medicine. The health center is governed by a community based non-profit board and has a present staff of five headed by Bill Deck (Avery), Executive Director. Dr. Dayle Hawthorne is the physician and acting Medical Director.

All residents of the area are eligible for services and charges will be based on family size and income. Call 377-6448 on or after the 26th for an appointment or further information. The OCHC is located at 317 W. Hill Street (see below).

The Community Center Of South Decatur



The Community Center has received a grant of \$150,000 from


an anonymous donor via the Metropolitan Atlanta Community Foundation! This has enabled the Community Center to pay off the entire principle on its mortgage to Scottish Rite, leaving only a debt for the revovation expenses of an estimated \$125,000 and for the accrued interest on the mortgage.

The building complex was designed by Atlanta's famous architect Neel Reid and has been unoccupied since 1976 when Scottish Rite Crippled Children's Hospital moved to new quarters. Purchased by south Decatur residents in 1979, the Community Center will eventually host and/or sponsor a wide assortment of community services and activities. The first such service to be housed in the Center is the Oakhurst Health Center which opens for business and begins renovation work this month.



COMMISSION NOTES

The <u>December 1st meeting of the</u>

<u>Decatur City Commission</u> is "old hat"

now, however, of possible interest
to some in s.e. Decatur, 8.4 acres

Estate was formerly made a part of
the DeKalb County Dearborn Park on
Midway Road.

At the <u>December 15th meeting</u>, a short street created in the Marta construction of the E. Lake Station was named Paden Circle in honor of former fire chief Hoyt Paden. Ten year veteran Assistant Police Chief Ed Matthews was confirmed as Police Chief.

The January 5th meeting began with the swearing in of Commissioners Candler Broom, Robert Carpenter, and Ted O'Callaghan. Mr. Carpenter was reelected Chairman (Mayor) for his second term and Mr. O'Callaghan was elected vice-Chairman (Assistant Mayor) for his first term. Three seats (two newly created) on the Board of Appeals were filled by Lamb Johnston, Tom Ramsey, and Leonard Thrower. William C. Fox was reappointed to his seat on the Sinking Fund Commission. Amy Plankenhorn's seat on the Recreation Board, Jim Philips' seat on the Planning Commission and Candler Broom's seat on the Board of Education were not filled. The Commission agreed to look at attendance records of Goals Committee members before appointments are made to that committee. Thomas O. Davis was reappointed city attorney and William P. Smith was appointed to his second term as Recorder's Court Judge.

The Commission accepted a report from the Board of Tax Assessors giving the assessed value of all Decatur property at \$137,980,700. This amount is 50% of fair market value.

Assistant City Manager Cal Horton showed plans for improvements to Fifth Avenue Park which would cost anywhere from \$15,000 to \$20,000 in Community Development Funds. Lyn Deardorff raised the issue of DeKalb County's poor repaving job on S. Candler, commenting that Candler was better off before the resurfacing.
