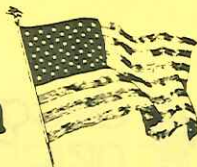

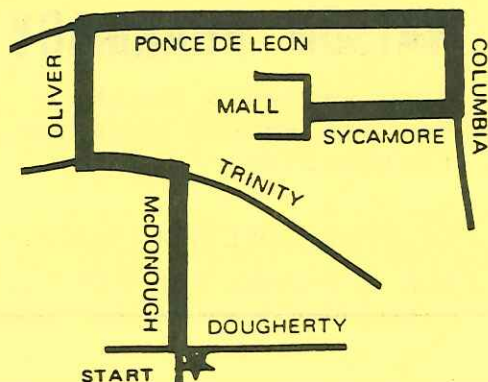
JULY 4th CELEBRATION

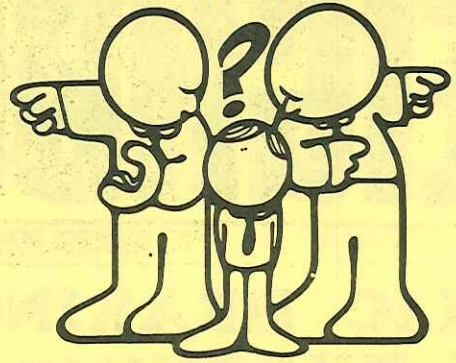

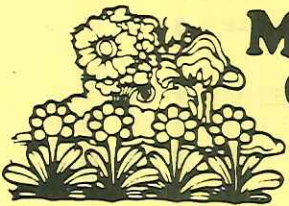

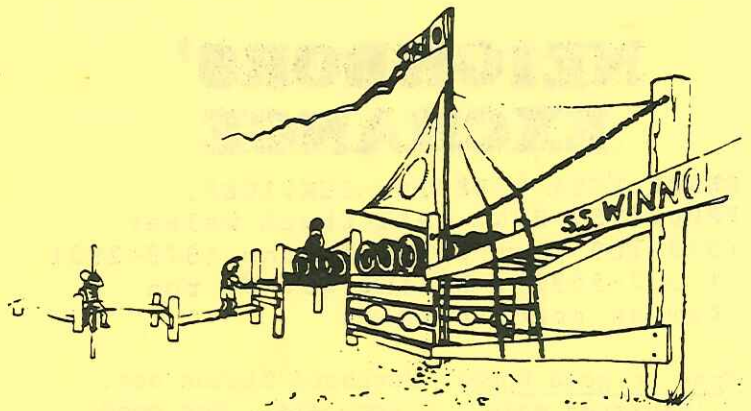

ARE WE LOOSING OUR PLAYGROUND FIELD?

Winnona Park doesn't really have a park. We have a field. The field is owned by the City of Decatur schools and used extensively by the YMCA for their youth soccer program.

Many neighborhood residents, both children and adults, use the field for volleyball, softball, basketball, football, frisbee throwing, kite flying and general playground recreation.

Have you really looked at the field lately? The hedge has advanced along the southern bank and is overtaking trees and the school building alike. Access to the field continues to be eroded paths down the banks. A muddy rut (with a rusting half buried trash can in the middle) is the walkway behind the building. Grass is rarely cut. The playing field has extensive areas which are badly worn. Use of the field for soccer has reduced the surface to clay and rock.

The field is a valuable neighborhood resource. Presently this resource is badly neglected.

If you haven't really looked at the field lately, go over and wander around. Is this condition tolerable? There are some neighbors who think not. What do you think? Watch the Newsletter for follow-up articles on this problem.
